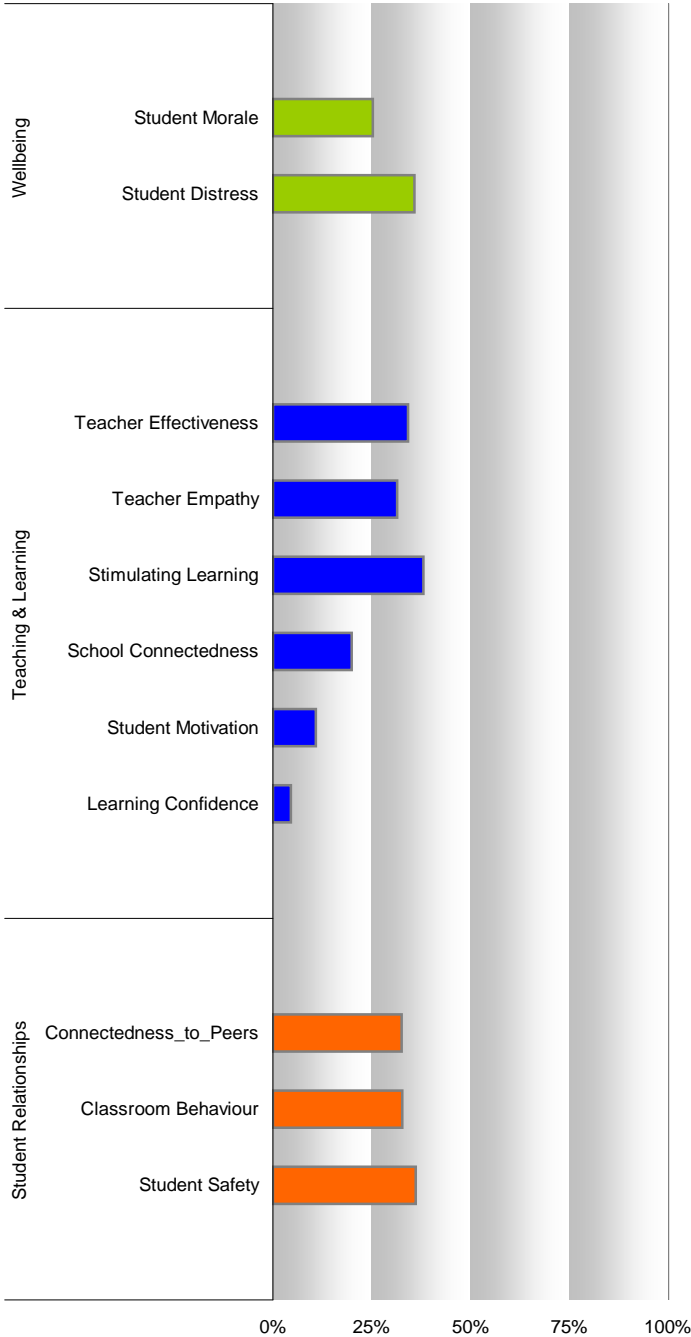


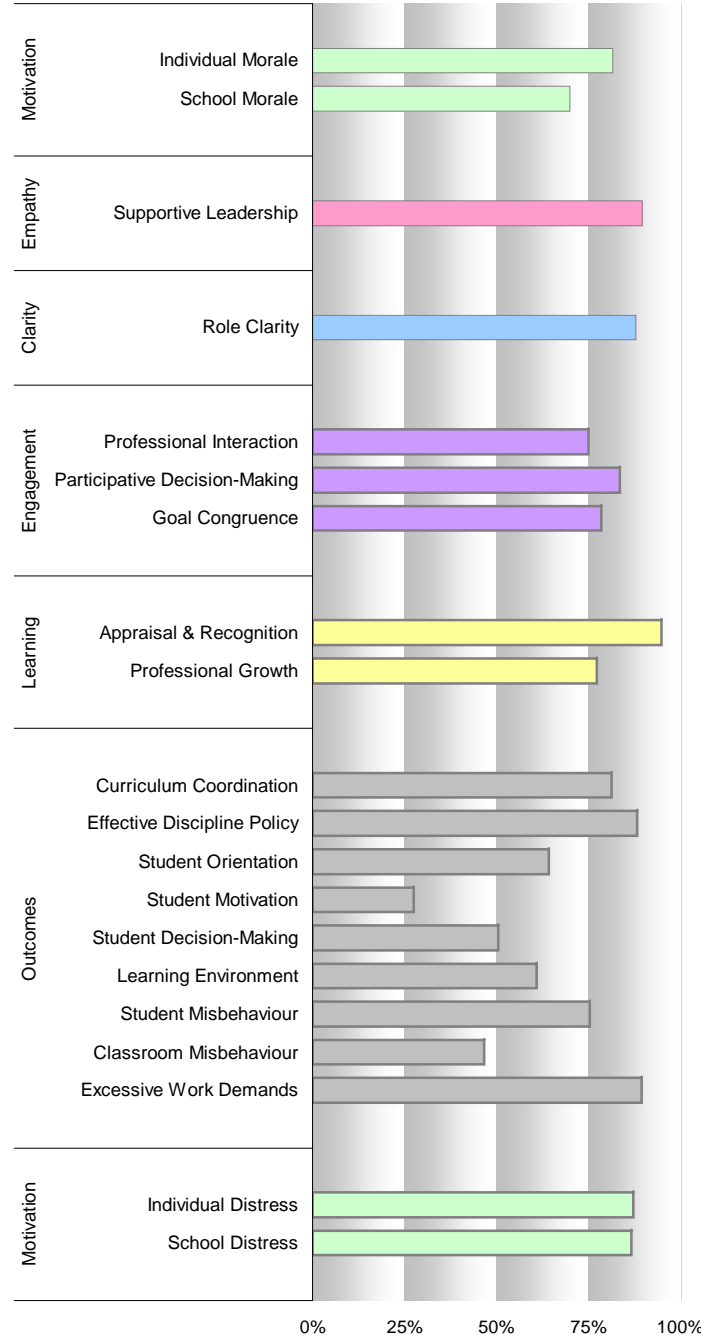

Strengths and Weaknesses against all schools with yr7-12 data



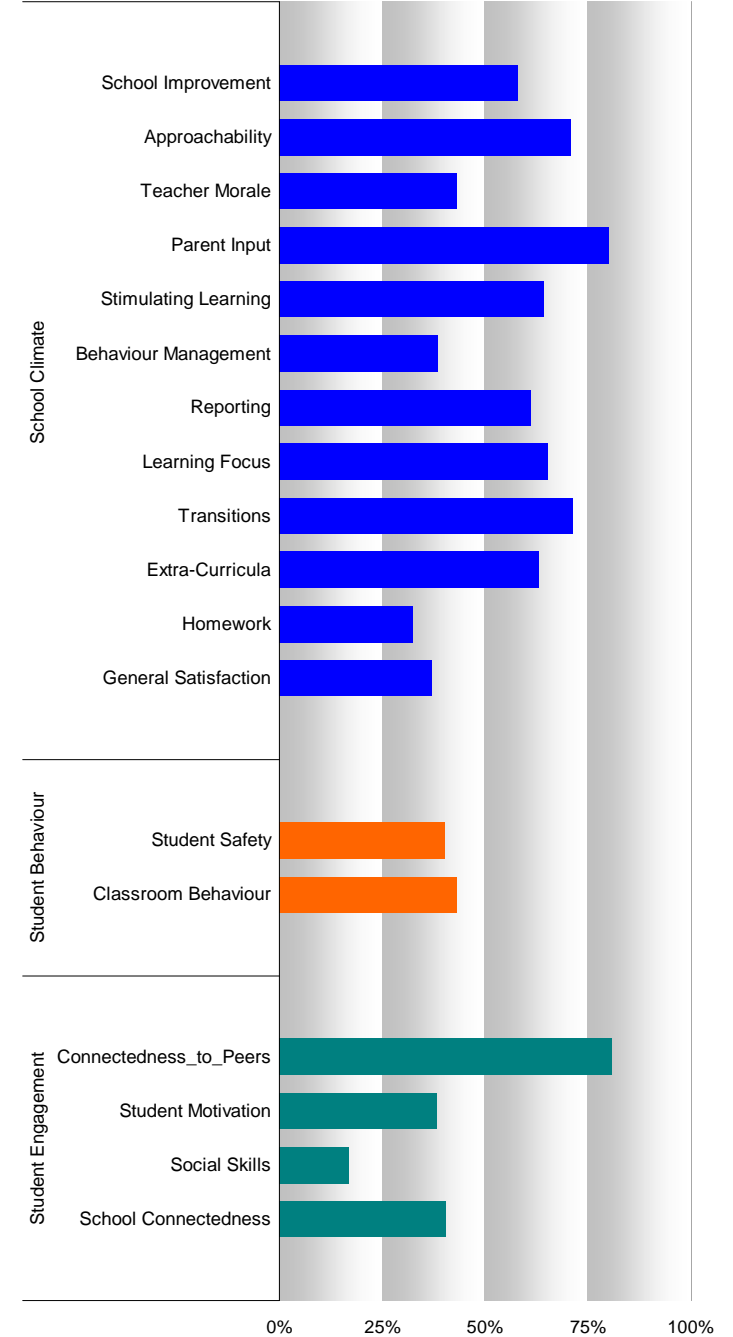
Staff Opinion Survey*

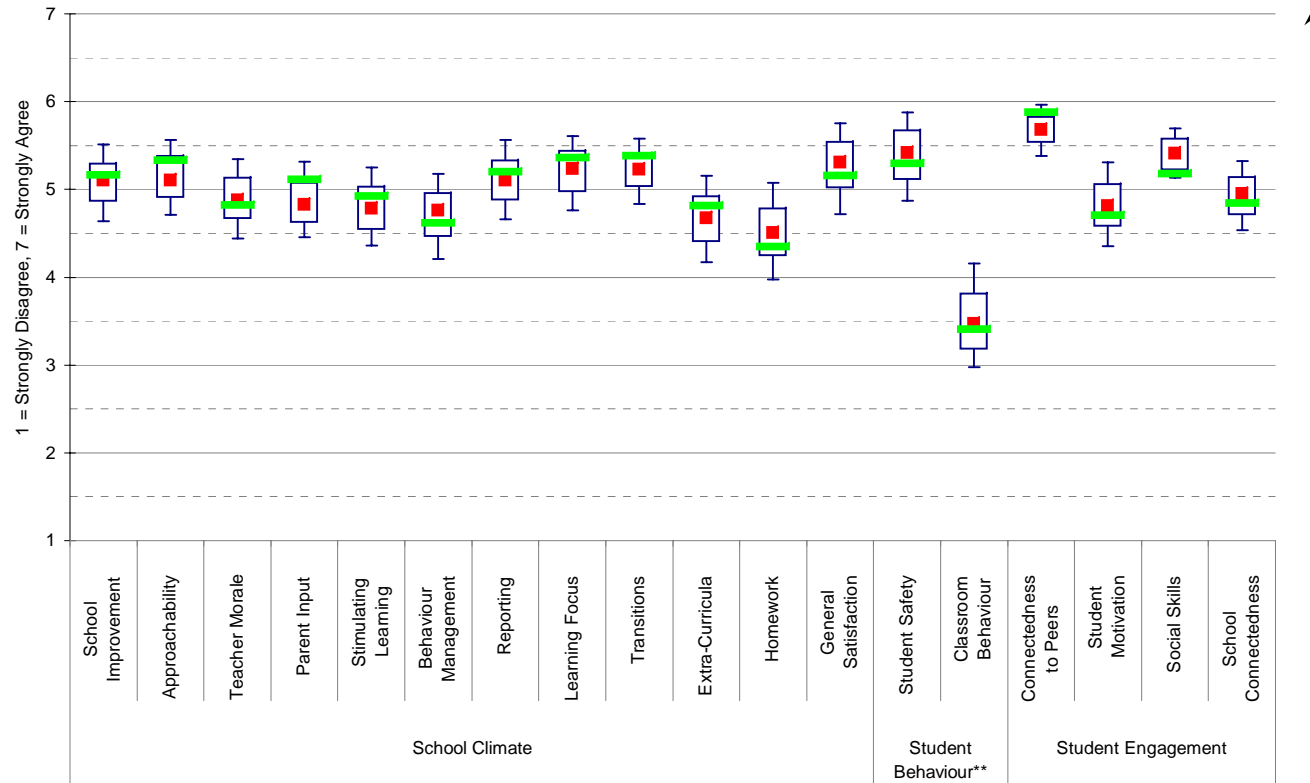

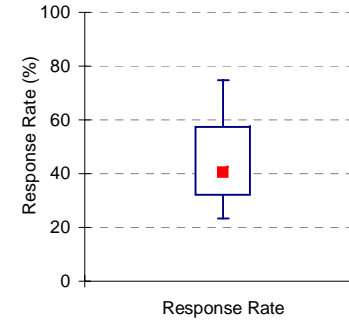
2007 Data against Secondary School benchmarks

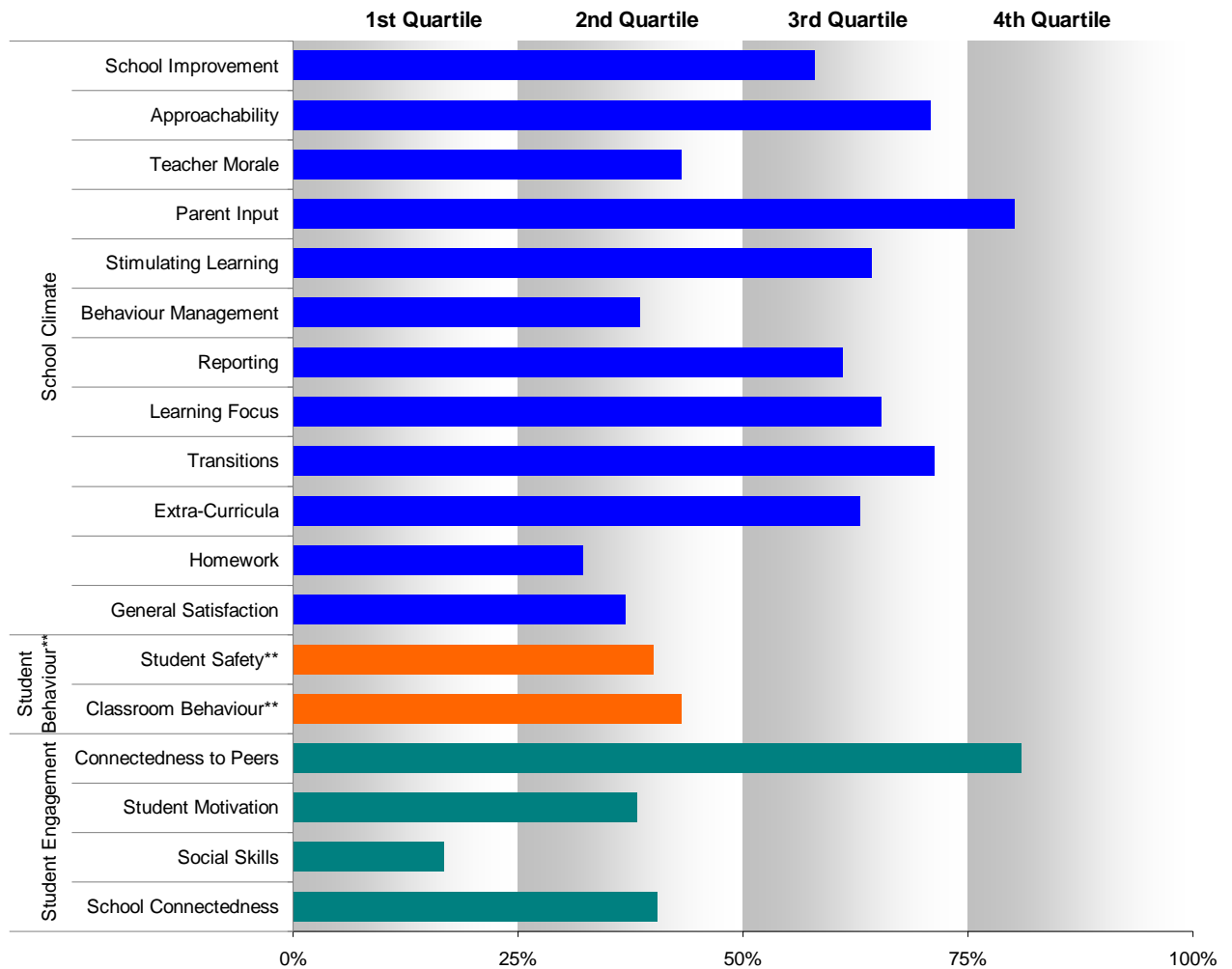

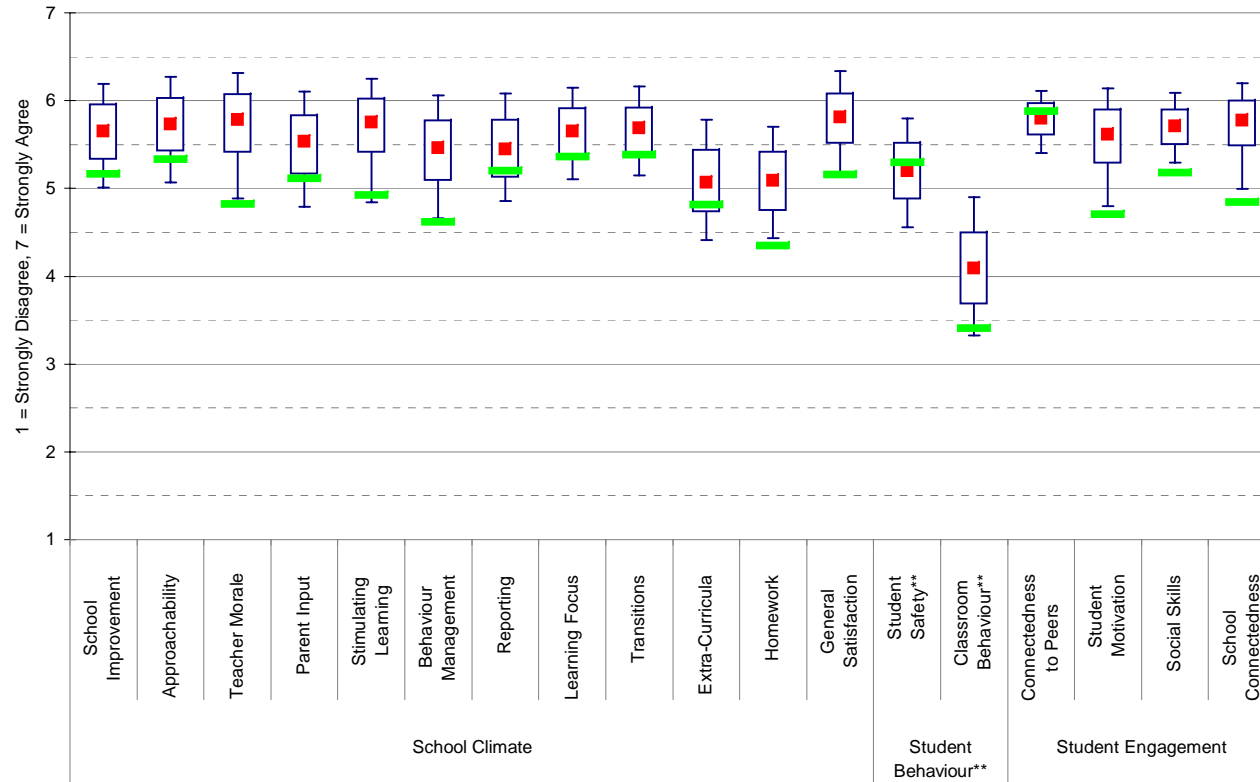

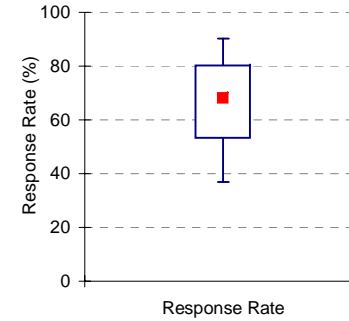
2007 Data against state-wide school benchmarks

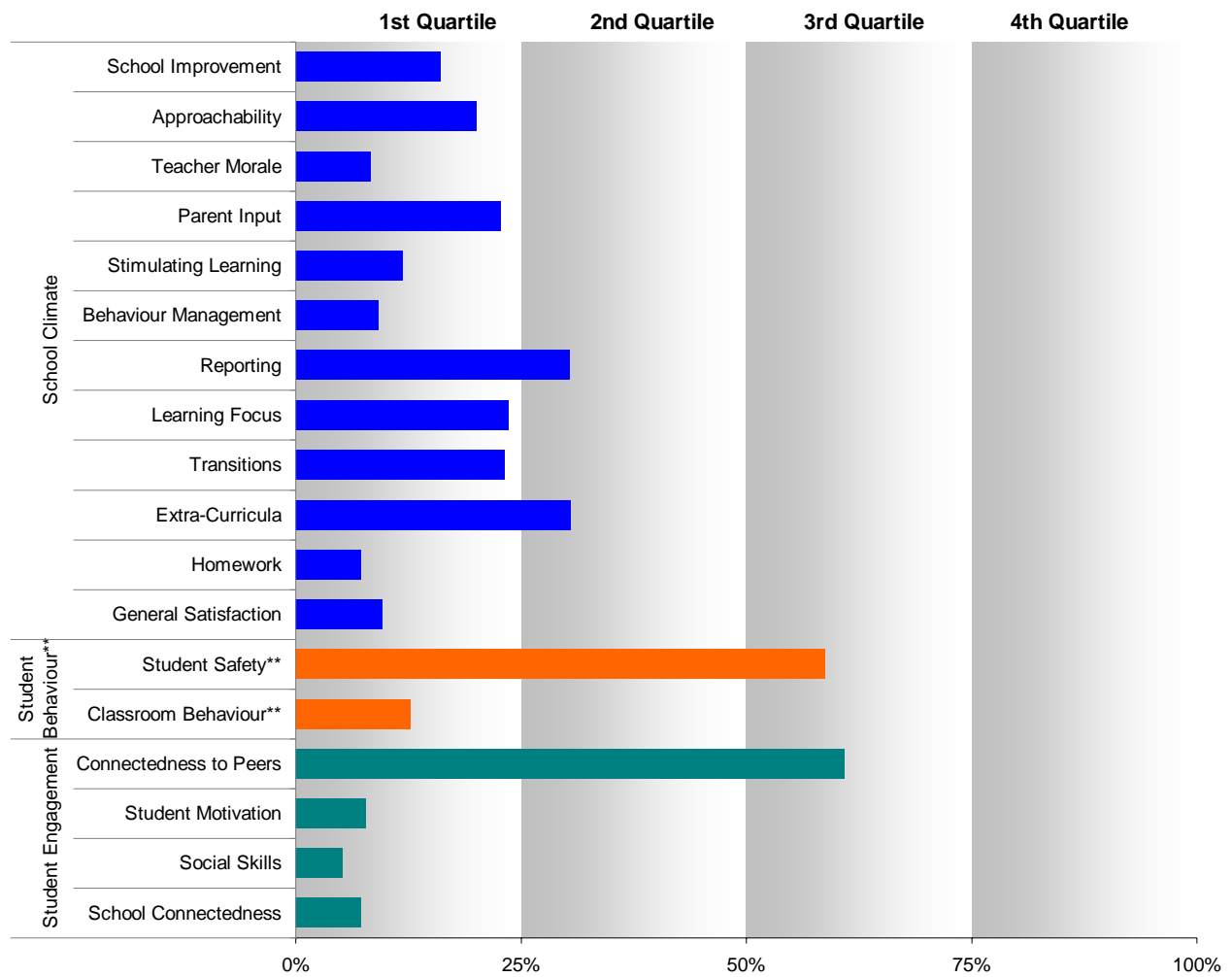

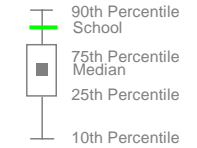

School response rate plotted against state-wide school distribution

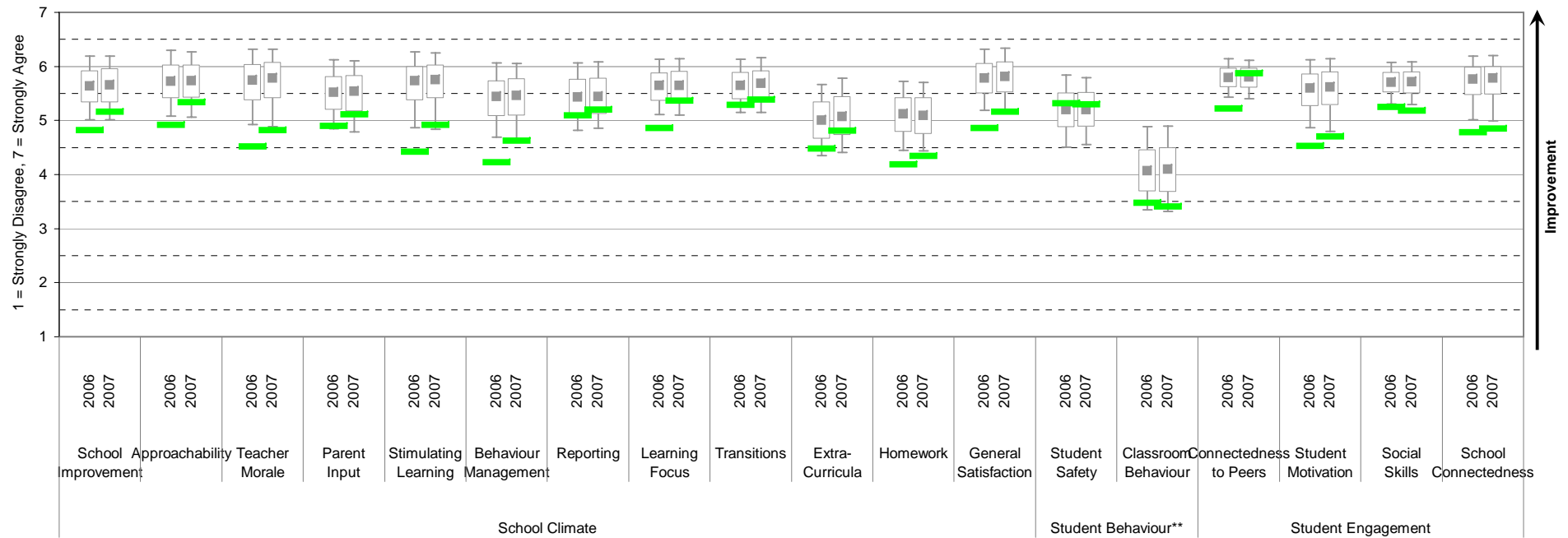

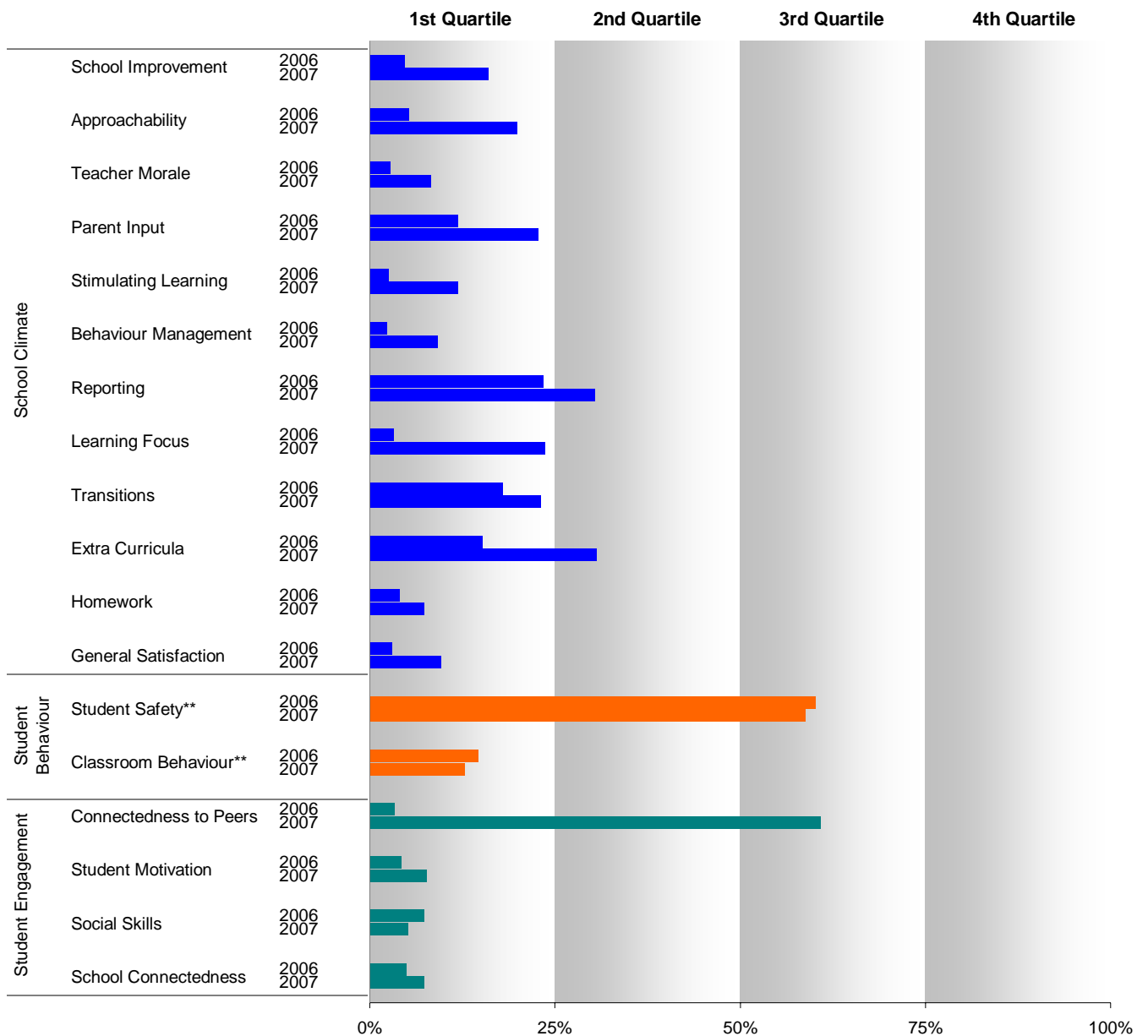
